



New teachers to be deployed in volatile N.Eastern counties

Education sector hit hard ever since nonlocal teachers fled the region following repeated attacks by armed men believed to be militants from the Al-Shabaab terrorist group

Inducation Cabinet Secretary Prof. George Magohahas announced that the Government will soon deploy new teachers in the volatile North Eastern region.

Prof. Magoha said the government was in the final stages of resolving the problem after the Teachers Service Commission (TSC) transferred more than 3,000 teachers from the region over concerns of insecurity.

"We are in the process of deploying new teachers in some parts of North Eastern to solve the teacher shortage crisis in the region," he said

The Teachers Service Commission had maintained it will not post teachers to North Eastern if the insecurity situation is not addressed.

Earlier, the TSC head, Dr Nancy Macharia had told Parliament that the right to life supersedes the right to education and called on the government to improve security in the region.

"If our teachers today are assured of security and safety, we will post some of them to those schools in the afternoon," Macharia told National Assembly's Education Committee.

"Right to life is sacrosanct

and supersedes all other rights," she said.

The teachers' employer meanwhile urged the local leaders to help the Commission mop up retired teachers below 65 years to help fix the current shortage. Speaking atPrideInn Beach Resort in Mombasa when he briefed the media

on the sidelines of Seventh Retirement Conference, Magoha said government has taken the necessary measures to ensure teachers are deployed in the region and their security guaranteed.

The massive transfer of teachers in North Eastern has paralyzed learning in the region resulting to protests by local leaders.

"Work is in progress and already so many local and non-local teachers are there. We are in the process of sending more teachers," said the CS who refused to give timelines for the deployment.

Magoha reiterated that the Leadership of the Northern region should identify students fit to be trained as teachers, so they can be trained a soon as possible.

"I am aware that there are 24,058 students in the

North-Eastern region who scored grade C plain and above. I don't see why we cannot train them to be teachers, to teach in their own locality," he said.

On his part, KNUT Secretary General Wilson Sossion urged TSC to work closely with the police to find a lasting solution to the situation.

"It is not an easy thing to comprehend that every few days, we bury teachers. let us not be emotional about this issue, but strive to find a lasting solution to the legitimate concerns raised," he said

The local leadership has been piling pressure on the Teachers Service Commission (TSC) to facilitate their immediate return but the teachers' employer is reluctant to agree without adequate guarantees of its workers' safety.

County acquires more coronavirus protective kits as defensive measure

Nakuru County Executive Committee Member for Health Dr. Zachary Gichuki has reassured residents of the devolved unit's preparedness for the corona virus, adding that his department had received another consignment of protective kit towards the same.

He said the County, in collaboration with the National government had heightened the level of preparedness and allayed fears that the devolved unit was not well equipped to handle the disease in the event of an outbreak.

"We have received from the National government face masks, shields, overalls, sanitizers, bedding materials and pharmaceuticals. The county has stepped up surveillance for corona virus at all major hotels and key tourist attraction sites in the region," he affirmed.

He said more than 70 hoteliers within Nakuru Town East Sub County and a further 30 from Naiva-

sha Sub-County, had been trained on surveillance and detection of the deadly virus. "We have collaborated with the Ministry of

health, Center for Disease Control and Washington State University to train 200 doctors, nurses, clinical officers and public health officers among others to step up preparedness against the outbreak," he added.

"The workers are drawn from Rift Valley Provincial General Hospital, Naivasha, Gilgil and Molo Sub County hospitals," said Dr. Gichuki

Area Public Health Chief Officer Mr. Samuel King'ori said the Health Department will continue to carry out public sensitization forums on the virus across the County.

He also announced that the devolved unit had instituted stop-gap measures in case there is any report of the virus now code-named Covid-19 that include setting up of a 24 bed isolation ward at the Nakuru Level 5 Hospital. Another isolation unit has also been set up at the Naivasha level 4 hospital. The disease has so far claimed 3,000 lives, mostly in the mainland China with close to 100,000 confirmed cases worldwide.

Statistics from Nakuru County indicate that Chinese tourists account for over 38pc of foreign visitors to the Lake Nakuru National Park.
